Like everyone else, though, clergy are busy all year round, not just at Christmas and Easter. You will all busy too, with Christmas shopping, arranging visits, going to Nativity Plays etc, as well as having all the everyday tasks that have to be done whatever the time of year. We all need time out from the stresses of modern daily life, and for me, going to church morning and evening (or to the chapel when I am on hospital duty) to say daily prayers is a respite from all the busy-ness. There I can be in God's Presence without the ringing of phone or door bell, without post and e-mails to read, or services to arrange or the 101 other things that may need to be done. Instead I bring my tasks for the day and my concern for all of you to our Heavenly Father either asking for His help during the day just beginning, or thanking Him for the day just ending, and I always come away feeling calmed and refreshed.

I hope that each of you has a few minutes each day when you are able to indulge in some "me" time, doing something you enjoy or find relaxing, especially in the run up to Christmas, because Christmas is not about trees and turkeys and presents. It's about God's free gift of Himself, coming to us in Jesus Christ, simply because He loves us. So please celebrate this most wonderful of gifts, but do not bankrupt yourself or wear yourself out, and if you need a bolt hole, do remember that both our churches are open each day, and that you are very welcome to go in for prayer or a wander around, or just to sit and enjoy the peace and quiet. And you never know, in that quietness you might just hear the angels singing, "Glory to the New Born King!"





The New Tarmac' Has Arrived!

How quickly things change! In the last edition of this magazine I reported on the problems relating to our plans to resurface the Memorial Hall car park. Now, even as I write, that work is very well advanced.

At its meeting on the 11th October, the Management Committee of The Hall decided to allow the recycling facility to continue to occupy part of the car park. The Parish Council very generously agreed to fund the additional cost of constructing the surface to a standard that would bear the weight of the lorries which service the facility, and the contract was placed.

By this coming weekend (26th November) the new tarmac surface will be complete and ready for use. During the following week, parking spaces will be marked out: safety areas, where vehicles must not be parked, will be identified, and a job that should last another 20 years or so, will be complete.

During the process of this work, the long standing mystery of the dampness in the South Western corner of the Building, on the southern side of the entrance doors (i.e. to their right, when facing the building) was solved and resolved. It transpired that the underground pipe that was supposed to carry the surface water to a soak-away under the tarmac, terminated in a bed of clay, some 60cm short of its intended target. Those of us who have spent so many frustrating hours with drain rods and high pressure hoses, trying to clear it can breathe a sigh of relief. The problem has been overcome with the addition of a short piece of pipe that will carry the water to the previously unused 'new' soak-away, installed by the Hall's

builders in 1983/4. Our chances of a refund are slim!

The net result of all this is that for the moment, we have had to shelve our plans to refurbish the 'Ladies', until that whole area of the building dries out: which is just as well because, our coffers are running a bit low! So circumstances have imposed upon us a prudent decision. (One that we would certainly have taken, anyway!),

We have also had to defer our plans to replace most of the Hall's Chairs, which are 28 years old, and have become very uncomfortable. We had budgeted £4,500 or so for this project, helped by an extremely generous donation from Kimpton Horse Show. In the event we have been unable to source a chair of sufficiently high quality, within our price range (£28ish. per Chair). Most of the chairs we have viewed probably would not last 5 years, let alone the twenty to which we aspire. The current chairs were bought in 1984, and were made to last, but only to a point, and certainly not for 30 years! Currently the Bench Working Party is fitting new rubber feet to those, and replacing the missing screws. We will have to make them last a short while longer. We are yet again greatly indebted to the BWP for its efforts.

In the meantime we will hold the Horse show's donation separately until we can use it for its intended purpose, and hope to raise additional funds. And if anybody knows of a source of reasonably priced really good quality stacking chairs, please let us know.

From From The Council Chair

II'm delighted to be able to report that the new Parish Council website is now going from strength to strength, as everyone involved gets used to using it, and posting information onto it. A very useful feature is the calendar, which we hope to grow into a collaborative 'village diary', so that visitors to the site can see a real overview of all that goes on in the community. If you haven't yet visited the site, please do so at www.kimptonparishcouncil.org.uk and let us know what you think. Obviously we're always open to suggestions for content and would particularly welcome some interesting photographs of the village that we can make use of throughout the site. Please note, though, that the Parish Council site does not replace the History Group site, which still has its home at www.kimptonvillage.tsohost.co.uk One important decision that was taken at the November meeting of the Parish Council was to cease the funding currently provided for the Police Community Support Officer that patrols the village. Under the existing arrangement, the Parish funds 50% of the time that a PCSO is in Kimpton (or in Peters Green or Blackmore End).

There was some debate over this decision, as you would expect, but we took into account the cost in terms of our precept, our experience over the past four years of having this funding in place, and community feedback. It was felt that the money (over 10% of our annual budget) could be used to greater benefit elsewhere. Accordingly, the provision of a PCSO in the Parish will reduce by 50% from April 2012, following the expiry of the current contract.

You may have seen or heard about a proposal to install a 'play-wall' in the village. A local company, WallJam, has an innovative product that was presented to the Parish Council some months ago, and which is currently the subject of a grant application. We will learn whether the application has been successful in early December, and if so we will then organise a consultation meeting, currently scheduled for January 11th 2012. No decision has currently been taken as to whether the project will proceed (even assuming the funding becomes available) nor about where the facility may be installed. All of this is open to consultation and debate, and we would like this to be as wide-ranging as possible, so please keep an eye out for further information, via the website, noticeboards or letter-drops.

I mentioned in my last newsletter that there had been little further news on the Lloyd Way development. I'm disappointed to say that nothing has changed for this quarter! Despite regular contact with the developers, we have received no further concrete information, so once again I'm having to say 'watch this space.'!

The Parish Council have also submitted a strong objection to proposals to charge for car parking in Welwyn Village. We feel that this particularly impacts on us as a rural community, because of the surgery there, and the regular need for parishioners to travel over there for surgery visits. We understand that objections were, as you would expect, widespread, and await a definitive outcome.

I will also add to the publicity surrounding the up-and-coming 'digital TV switchover', which is scheduled to take place in the first half of 2012 in our area. In case this has passed you by, it means that the analogue TV transmitters will be switched off, so unless you have made provision via Freeview or Freesat digital services, or unless you subscribe to Sky etc., you will be unable to access broadcast TV services.

For further information on this, see the Parish Council website, or call the Digital UK Advice Line on 08456 505050, or visit www.digitaluk.co.uk There will be a lot of publicity about this in the coming months, so I'm sure nobody will be left behind! Finally, on behalf of the Parish Council, may I wish everyone a peaceful and comfortable Christmas, and all good wishes for 2012.

Who Says School Is For Kids?

A review by *Aidan Phillips* of the Kimpton Players' recent production "The Flint Street Nativity"

Tim Firth's comedy provides an insight into the minds of the worldly innocent, as it follows a class of 7 year-olds (played by adult actors) through rehearsals for their school nativity. What you find is a miniature society of eager yet naïve little people, all trying to understand and find their place in the confined world of the classroom around them. Their confusion is the audience's pleasure; watching it is just pure fun.

Dissecting the commotion of a classroom, 'The Flint Street Nativity' presents us with all manner of individual conversations ensuing between the children. With a broad variety of all your usual suspects – the demanding bully, miss know-it-all, the introverted romantic, etc – the end result is a compelling narrative with enough diverse personalities to entertain throughout. Consistently raising smiles in the first half, the second part will have you frequently laughing out loud as the children continuously misinterpret what they have heard their parents say and relay their opinions through humorous twists on well-known carols. The foundation joke of adults playing kids thankfully maintains its humour right through; whether this was ever going to work was always going to depend on the quality of the acting, and the Kimpton Players rise to the challenge brilliantly.

To be original in a millennia-old art isn't easy, so appraisal goes to Firth for his creative turn at the end with the actors changing into suits to play the parents of their child character. As disappointing as it is to see the kids being replaced by these more serious and less comical adults, the change allows for an interesting contrast between the minds of the young and old as well as a rather poignant ending, adding a new emotional dimension to the production.

Its well-balanced mix of slapstick and subtle adult humour creates a play which is fun for all the family to watch, although I'd imagine that the parents would appreciate it most. For its only as you get older that you begin to realise that children – trying to understand this perplexing world around them – make the funniest comedians of all.

Community Policing

If you need to contact either officer and you miss them during their walk-abouts the quickest way to make telephone contact with any officer is to use the new automated system at County HQ on 01707 354192 where you must clearly identify the officer you wish to speak to. It really does work. Our Ward Constable now has an increased responsibilities covering Wymondeley and Graveley. Did you know that PCSO's now have powers to issue on the spot fines to motorists for a number of offences inc. inconsiderate parking, anti-social driving(e.g. driving on the verge or footpath), failure to display a valid tax disc and causing an unnecessary obstruction. You have been warned !

Police Target Issues

They continue to be reductions in Metal Theft, Fly Tipping, Anti- Social Behaviour, Hare Coursing and 4x4Off-roading, so if you witness any of these crimes actually taking place you should ring 999. If it's after the event ring 101.

Valuable assistance/intelligence is being provided by local riding stables, farmers and gamekeepers as part of Farm Watch and Horse Watch. Business and Dog Watches now operate in this area together with the new Transport Watch covering bus and cab operators.

New Hi- tech Property Marking – Selecta DNA

Unfortunately Selecta DNA is no longer available at the special price of £15 and is now £50 for a bottle of marking fluid containing thousands of micro-dots, invisible to the naked eye, but will show up under UV light. The fluid is part of a kit including brush and warning labels for attaching to the item and your entry doors. There is sufficient fluid to mark about 50 items and is unique to your home, so it is not possible to share with a neighbour, and enables the police to trace stolen items to your household. OWL On-line Watch Link

easily completed NHW OWL Consent Form available from WLO Jill Dockley at Jill.Dockley@herts.pnn.police.uk Once on line you can have a look at the "Fix my Street" link and you can let the council know about broken street lights, potholes, graffiti etc.

Reported Local Crime

Latest figures confirm Kimpton as a low crime area and all Herts crime is at a 10yr. low, but we must not be complacent as there have been local burglaries and theft from and of motor vehicles. Also please be aware that Bogus Callers and Identity Theft continue to be a threat and please be particularly alert when operating a cash machine and keep an eye on your handbags and wallets in supermarkets.

Theft of manhole covers and valuable cabling is a real problem.

Shed and garage security advice

Please remember not to leave your gardening equipment and DIY tools on view and follow some basic steps such as always lock your shed/ garage door securely and :-

Ensure that they have the right locks to enhance security.

Consider purchasing a shed alarm which is sensitive to vibrations.

Metal "up and over" garage doors can be secured with additional locks fitted to either side and/or a floor mounted closed shackle padlock

Wooden garage doors can be secured with two substantial hasps and staples and closed shackle padlocks (your local DIY store should be able to advise on the appropriate lock for your application).

Caring Neighbours

You should always check on elderly, vulnerable and neighbours living alone and remind them not to let unexpected callers into their house. If in doubt call the Police immediately on 999.

Night Security and Absence

During absence ensure that your property is secure with all windows, doors, garages and sheds properly locked. Make it look 'lived in' if possible by parking a vehicle in front of your garage or at least on the drive. If your absence is for more than a day give a neighbour your contact details. Use timer switches on a lamp fitted with an energy saving bulb of course.

Upvc doors with handle operated shoot bolts or claws must be double locked with the key, Don't leave any keys within sight of an open letter box.

A busy few months, as usual, some of it out of our familiar environment. A request came for Ayot St Lawrence Church (the modern one) - could we look at their gravestones and advise on their repair? This was no doubt as a result of Lorraine being responsible for both (ecclesiastical) Parishes. We went to have a look and ended up repairing them ourselves. It was a very enjoyable few Wednesday mornings, particularly because having mended countless gravestones in Kimpton churchyard, we now have some idea as to what to do. Ayot PCC gave us a handsome donation which more than covered our costs. We also renovated the benches outside the war memorial in Ayot, one of which was given by Lord Brocket to celebrate a royal jubilee - about 1937, so well worth preserving. (Once again, all costs paid for). We have been asked to repair some broken graves in the grounds of the ruined church too!

Back to Kimpton, we repaired the kissing gate and fence at the entrance to Park Wood, (thank you Simon and Emma Thomson for a donation to our funds) and renovated and refurbished many benches including several ex Probyn 'sweetheart' benches that are now installed outside the bungalows in Lloyd Way (thank you ladies for your donation). We have tidied up the Rec a bit - painted the railings at the top, improved the fit of the gate at the entrance, washed off some offensive graffiti from the brick wall, removed some overhanging branches from the footpath steps at the top. In the High Street area we cleaned the bus shelter outside the school and stained the notice board nearby, painted the war memorial railings ready for the Remembrance Parade, and cut away the grass and soil growth on the pavements of Park Lane and Canham Close. (We are working our way around the village, so hopefully all our pavements will get this treatment over the winter).

Another project we are engaged in is the repainting (and minor repairs) of Church House. This summer the outside wooden cladding and windows have been painted, and now - on wet days - we have started on the inside. Similarly we do regular maintenance work on the Memorial Hall.

There are a lot more things we have done around the village, but that must be enough to read for now. If anyone wants to help, we met every Wednesday morning, do get in touch. Finally, grateful thanks to the Horse Show for their recent donation - the village organisations are very kind to us, and it makes our job so much easier if we know we have funds to carry them out.
